

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PATTERN: IT'S ALWAYS SUNNY IN PHILADELPHIA

You will need:

- 16 count aida fabric
- 1 DMC thread (colours included on final page)

How to complete this design:

To Begin

Ensure you have enough aida to stitch the entire design, which can be done by estimating the centre. Fold your fabric in half horizontally and vertically to find the centre point, and use the black arrows as a guide to find this. Once you know you have plenty, feel free to start from whichever point you like on the pattern!

Knots on the back will show through, so you might just want to begin stitching with new colours by leaving a small tail of thread behind the fabric instead. One you have completed your first cross stitch, it will secure the thread into place.

Stitching

It is important that all the X's are crossed in the same direction. That means the top thread of the X should always slant in the same direction (either \ or /). It does not matter which way they slant, but if they are mixed, the finished piece will look uneven. Use 2 strands of your DMC thread together for each stitch unless stated otherwise.

Most importantly:



Don't worry if you don't have the exact thread colour listed, choose your favourite colours instead to modify the design a little. This is YOUR project!


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Sundown Stitcher
